A Message from Rabbi Rachel

I'm writing this on February 7; tomorrow, I will have been at CBTBI for exactly one month. Today is the second day of Adar, the happiest month in the Jewish calendar. For both these reasons, it seems like an especially good time to write my first

Shofar article, introduce myself, and share with you what I've been up to during my short time at CBTBI.

When Dan and I discussed coming to join the CBTBI community, we knew it would be a big change in our lives, and in the lives of our daughters, Fay (age four), and Nora (age two). But there were so many reasons to come, it just seemed b'sheret, like it was meant to be. We bought a yellow house in Collingswood, big enough for our parents — who are, more importantly, our kids' grandparents — to come stay with us regularly. We're *almost* all unpacked, and are looking forward to hosting CBTBI on the afternoon of Sunday, April 7. We enrolled Fay and Nora in the JCC preschool so that they could be together, and in an environment where, as a rabbi's kids, they'd feel at home. It's amazing how well they've transitioned. At CBTBI, it's been a wonderful immersion for me. I've led services, attended committee meetings, visited classrooms, and led a participatory Shabbat School. I've gotten to know many of you at the "Nosh and Schmooze" programs that Caryl has organized, and many of you have opened your homes, and your hearts to me. I've gotten to know the way the office works, and even had help from the seventh grade class, and then from the confirmation class, in labeling and unpacking my books. I had an interview with the editor of "The Jewish Voice," met Rabbi David Levin (he says hello to everyone!), and will be attending my first Tri-County Board of Rabbis meeting next week. I've started planning holiday celebrations for Purim, Passover, and Shavuot, and I was given a wonderful cameo in the Purim play. I even spoke with a tipsy member or two at the Night at the Races, and, even though I didn't bet correctly on a single race, I won a gift basket (tickets to the Pitman Broadway Theatre). And, all this in only a month!

I'm generally around CBTBI Tuesday through Friday during the day, and on Wednesday I'm here late for school. I'm also available as needed for evening or Sunday meetings. 

all people with respect and kindness.



Walk in and find me:

My office hours are, in general, 9-5 Tuesday and Thursday; on Wednesday I'm in until 7ish; on Friday I leave at 2ish, and then come back before services. I'm here on Fridays and Saturdays for services and every other Sunday for school and meetings. I'm available for evening meetings, but try to keep them to one or two evenings a week. If you're going to stop by, please call me first or check with the office to confirm that I'm available.

Call or email me:

You can always call me at (856) 589-6550, ext. 4. I check this number from wherever I am. I am the only person checking this voicemail, so it's confidential. Please use this number, except in emergencies. Email me at rabbi@cbtbi.org.

Emergencies:

If you are contacting me in general, please use the number above. In case of emergency, you can reach me on my cell at (617) 208-8813. This number is for members only, and should only be used in cases of pastoral emergency.

Facebook:

I'm on Facebook at Rachel Dvash Schoenfeld (Rabbi Rachel Schoenfeld). I'd like to be friends! I've also joined the CBTBI Members Facebook page, and recommend you do, too. I'm glad to connect with you on Facebook, and will continue using it for more informal connections, and for outreach.

Time on, time off:

Being a rabbi, especially one with two young kids, is a balancing act! It was very important to me to have time off spelled out in my contract, so that I can spend time with my family. I have off every Monday, every other Sunday, and one weekend every other month. These times off are marked clearly on the private CBTBI calendar. Please DO contact me in cases of pastoral emergency even if I'm off.

Getting to know every single member:

Congratulations to Our Recent and Upcoming B'nai Mitzvah


Jacob Veytsman — February 16, 2019

He sends a special thank-you to his family; Hebrew school teachers; his tutor, Misha Feldman; and Mrs. Marder.


